“What About Refunds?” and “Contributing to the Oregon Federation News”. Please take this back to your clubs. The OFN on line is coming along good. It had a slow start up but as we become comfortable with it, it is getting better and easier to use. There are about 225 people that have sign up for it. I have given out the Insurance forms, so check your folder for that.

The Randall Award was awarded to Paul and Dotti Swenson. Only two couples were nominated this year. Anyone can nominate a person or couple. The paperwork needs to be submitted to Dave Cooper by the July state meeting. This form is also on the web site.

Kathy Roberts is the Youth Advisor, she reminded us if you have a youth dancer that need financial help to go to an Oregon state festival let her know, there is money available to pay for their ribbons. Also there are monies for scholarship for college.

Marilyn Schmit is going to try and have 5 days of square dancing at the State Fair, Saturday is reserved for the youth.

Floyd Bard reported that State trailers are in good shape. Call him to reserve them.

The Federation dues were increased from \$3 to \$20 a year for all clubs and councils. The “When and Where” fee for clubs and councils that ranged from \$10 to \$30 has been eliminated.

The Wave Steppers received a grant of \$400 from the Federation.

Please be aware there is an accident report form on the Federation website and this is to be filled out and submitted very soon after an accident; it is the responsibility of the host club of the venue to do this but everyone involved should make sure that it is done. If this is not done, you could have **big time lawsuits** for not doing this!

We have beat the bushes to find new TVC officers for the coming year. At this point we have Gary and Joyce Clark agreeing to run again for President. Dale Brabham has agreed to do the same for VP. Tom will stay on as Secretary, Lane has agreed to run again for Treasurer, and also Kathy Worthington is staying on as Federation Delegate for the TVC. Are there any nominations from the floor? The remaining couples should join hands and step back giving room, forming a protective circle around the injured person and raise hands. Upon seeing signal someone should call for medical help if it appears to be necessary.

Gary told us the Pizza Caboose is now closed so we will need to find another location for our meetings. The officers will see what they can find in the way of a meeting place and bring the proposal to the next meeting. The February meeting is planned to be at the Hillsboro Fellows Hall and be aware there is additional parking behind the Premier Community Bank across the street.
