Many of our clubs in the state are continuing to receive scam emails requesting money from the clubs. They are getting more clever and we need to be even more vigilant. Tim Roberts as State Parliamentarian/Webmaster sent out a message to the OFSRDC which I forwarded to the TVC earlier this month. I've attached a copy of his message for your information in case you did not receive a copy for your perusal. Please consider setting up some code word, or mandatory phone confirmation, or mandatory Board approval before issuing any checks to an outside, unexpected party. The one thing that Tim mentioned is if you receive a scam email – do not respond. Delete it. If you respond, you have verified your address with the scammers.

State Parliamentarian/Webmaster's message regarding Scam Emails:

My friends, there is an email scam being perpetrated on our square dance clubs by email. One Federated club has lost nearly their entire treasury to this scam, and is now struggling to pay their monthly bills. You all need to be aware of this scam and how to recognize it.

Someone has compiled a list of the names and email addresses of the club presidents and treasurers. This could have been acquired through many sources of publicly available information, such as directories, web sites, or corporation info. In the scam, the club treasurer

receives an email that appears to be from the club president, saying something like "Please send a check for \$1,200 to such-and-such address to cover their invoice."

The key tell here is that the sender's email address does not match the actual club president's email address. If you send a response, they will return a seemingly reasonable explanation as to why the money should be sent, but the problem is you aren't actually communicating with the club president. You're talking to the scammer.

Because we have an email address, there is a chance the scammer can be tracked down, and law enforcement is on the case. In the meantime, if your club or council treasurer receives an email that seems to be from the president requesting that a check be mailed, they need to double-check the sender's email address. If the email address does not belong to the president, DELETE the message. Take no further action. Do not respond.

Also please understand that, just because you receive an email like this does NOT mean that the president's email account was hacked. Any one of you could go into your email settings right now and change your "real name" field to be "Tim Roberts". Any messages you send after that would go out with my name but your email address. The "real name" field is just a convenience.

In the short term, clubs might think about how to mitigate this. For example, you could set up a temporary policy that a requests for a check must be confirmed by telephone, or maybe establish a code word that must accompany check requests.
