# **Officer Reports:**

# President's report: (Kay Rogers)

# **Old Business:**

**Summer Festival in 2015 plan dropped and now considering a 2016 bid:** Since Interstate Highlanders (Klamath Falls) are interested in doing the Summer Festival in 2015, and they have not done one for many years; the TVC does not want to interfere with them, but we are now thinking about doing the 2016 Summer Festival. That being said we will need to put together a "Bid" and to do that we need things put together like a committed venue such as Seaside Convention Center, a budget, people (clubs), callers ,and cuers, etc.

Toe Draggers Club discussed in their club meeting the subject and agreed to support the TVC should they decide to bid for the 2016 time. The Sunset Promenaders, Eager Beavers also agreed to support a Summer Festival. Verna France stated that putting on a Summer Festival is a lot of work, and they should know because they have put on two festivals lately. Kathy Roberts commented that it makes a difference where you hold the festival as to how much work is involved, PAC has been using a school and with that you do most of the work, verses doing it at Seaside Convention Center for example which is a distance away from Portland but Center does a lot of the work. Also the rent is so much cheaper, about \$1,500 compared to \$9,000. Kay plans on telling the State officers that the TVC is interested in doing 2016 Summer Festival at the September State Meeting. Kay says what is involved to be successful is to do promotion, huggers at the door, people to work the registration table, persons to schedule and coordinate with the callers and cuers, etc. The hardest part is to get people enthused to come and support it. It was voted on and passed by hand vote that we are interested in a 2016 Summer Festival.
