Treasurer report: (Lane Clem)

Lane distributed treasurer's reports and he noted the following:

1. Dance Profit/Loss \$419.50 - Profit from "Here Comes Summer Dance" less \$85.00 Expense paid in previous month. See attached Dance Financial Report
2. Class expense (\$200.00) - Hoedowners Class Advertising Reimbursement
3. Donation expense (\$100.00) - Donation to Oregon Food Bank
4. Fees and Dues Income Total \$70.00 - Clubs' annual TVC Dues received
5. Fees and Dues Expense Total (\$10.00) - TVC's annual state dues paid
6. Administrative Expense Total (\$13.80) - Sunshine cards and postage
7. YTD Profit/Loss is \$381 better than budgeted.

We have \$519 of fabric in inventory to be used for the Summer Festival in 2016 outfits; this will go down as we sell the fabric.

Lane also distributed a copy of the 2014-2015 Budget; this report included actual expenses for several prior years. He also has a few copies of the TVC's Council Annual Financial Report if anyone is interested in reading that.

Secretary report: (Tom Sminia)

- We are not doing well at posting flyers; we can do better. I recently surveyed some Clubs boards for flyers posted at dances.
 - Checked Sunset Promenaders board and no new flyers and later found out the TVC Delegate forgot the flyers at home.
 - Checked Hoedowners board and found no Sunset Promenaders flyers.
 - Checked Toe Draggers board and no Sunset Promenaders flyers.
 - This was just an un-scientific survey to see if we are posting our flyers and it points out that we are not using the flyers we have made. So please do our job as Delegates of posting flyers, and help us communicate between clubs and dancers about our dances; we need to promote dancing to our dancers, not just for new dancers but our experienced dancers too.
 - In July since we will not be have a meeting; I will email out any flyers I receive to each delegate of each club; actually I will send flyers out anytime I get any unless someone tells me not to do it.
- I need your help in proof reading the directories pages.
 - Please carefully read each name, phone number, address, emails, the heading with the club dance information, special dances of the year, etc. With your help last year there was only one correction that I am aware of thanks to your inputs. If you don't have the information check with whoever does your club roster.
 - Email me any corrections by June 30th.
 - After proof reading we will be publishing the directory in early July.
 - Since there is probably no July meeting we will try to distribute them as the opportunities arise, and will have them at the August meeting.
 - When directory is completed we will put it on the TVC website.

- Please also email me your updated club roster because I need those for contact information during the year.

State Delegates report and Federation Youth Advisor: (Kathy Roberts)

- Mid-Winter presented a check in the amount of \$6500 to the Federation. Attendance was 1300. Goal for 2015 is 1325 attendance.
- During Summer Festival, dancing in the Mainstream Hall, Plus Hall and Round Dance halls were videotaped and are available to watch or used as a promotional at www.iHigh.com/crookcountycowboys
- Lisa Kious' Directory of Clubs and Special Dances/Festivals was distributed. We received enough for each club to receive 2. If you would like more, you can download and print them from the Federation website (www.squaredance.gen.or.us).
- Country Capers (PAC) has disbanded – may go to a traveling club
- Benefit dance was moved to a Saturday evening in hopes that everyone would attend. Flyers were distributed during our last meeting. Please remember to send your donation if your club is unable to attend.
- Randall Award – deadline has been changed to July 1st. Please let Vivian know if you are sending her a nomination. (*TVC Nomination for Swenson has been submitted*)
- Caller Report – Leonard Snodgrass – Mid-Willamette area is going to start picking a call that the dancers don't call very often "Do Paso". They are going to feature a call a month in all of the clubs so help review and learn these calls that aren't used very often.
- State Fair – accepted 2 solid dates and 1 tentative date. Still do not have a more dates. There has been a change in the management.
- The Youth will be dancing on Labor Day from 10:00-11:30 and KC Curtis will be the caller. Jonny Roberts has also been asked and is checking on his conflict. All dancers who are young at heart and like loud fast music are invited to join us.
- The Federation will be awarding one \$500 Educational Scholarship to a dancer in the Mid-Willamette area.
- During Midwinter 2015, the youth activities will be around travel adventure theme. During some of our activities, we will be "traveling" through different countries which have square dancing as their national dance. We will continue with the Badge Passport (badge search) again this year. More exciting plans will be released during our next meeting and in the OFN.
- State Trailers have been improved and repaired. They are ready for clubs to borrow them.
- The State Directories will go to the printer Mid-August and will be distributed in September

- **Club Delegates – how many State Directories does your club want? => Price will be similar to last year’s price which was \$3.05 per copy. Deadline for ordering directories is August 1. I will notify you of the price as soon as it has been confirmed. Please email Kathy@4roberts.us with your count. Thanks!**
- Grant committee moved to accept Joe Wrabek (TVC - Wave Steppers) request for financial assistance to attend caller school and housing assistance. Full tuition was approved.
- There have been many complaints about the OFN since River Graphics has assumed 100% management of the magazine.
 - OFN is currently losing about \$7000 a year
 - Ads are being lost
 - Currently only about 25% of the Federated dancers are now subscribing. Two years ago, we were up to 1000 subscription – it is now about 600.
 - Because of problems they are going to do a financial audit of the OFN.
 - When all this is done and decided; if necessary refunds will be given where needed.
- Motion was made to move the magazine to a web page.
 - Allows 100% of all dancers, anywhere in the world to see your ad and club information
 - Motion was sent to a committee for consideration. Tim Roberts, Vivian Fairburn, and Zola Jones are on the committee.
 - Proposed Webpage needs to be planned. One of the options being discussed is to allow clubs to post information and comments separate from the flyers – it is all under discussion by the committee.
- The summer festival attendance awards: Wood Award won by the Charlie Brown Squares (Medford) and the Chairman’s Award won by KC Squares (Klamath Falls)
- An invitation was issued to all of the dancers in the Federation to attend a Wave Steppers’ dance this summer to help keep them afloat. The Toe Draggers and Eager Beavers are visiting them on July 12th; hope other clubs will do this also. George Clark is calling and cueing.
- To promote square dancing one idea for consideration is to have family members invited to attend lesson graduation and potluck. Then at the conclusion to have a one night stand type short dance for non-dancers to help gain more class members; and then members.
- **Club Delegate & Presidents: Barb Wines, OFSRDC Publicity Chairman would like to compile a list of all of the things that clubs have tried during the last 5 years for finding, teaching, and keeping new dancers. Be sure to let her know if the different ideas were a success or failure. She would like to have the information ready for publication by the State Meeting in September.**

If no report is received by the deadline, your club will not have a report in the TVC section of the Club Reports section of the OFN. If you know that your club will not be submitting a report, I need to know that also so that I won't be bothering you a second time.

Attached are your reports as submitted to Joyce Sherman, editor of the OFN, for the July issue. This can be used as a reminder about what you may have already covered. I have also been asked to include the "Guidelines" document as a reminder and information for new reporters.

As a reminder, may I suggest that when you submit your report, do so with a "reply" to this message and then substitute your club name in place of the word "Reminder" in the "Subject" line. This will help me see your report when it comes in. I have missed a

report in the past because I did not recognize the subject line. Thank you for this. If your mailer will not let you do a substitution in the "Subject" line, just create a new message and type in your Subject line as "OFN August Report - ClubName".

Write about upcoming August events and anything special that your club did or was involved with in May. If your classes are starting or already underway you can talk about that. Do not write about May or July events. Just remember that this report for the OFN will not be read until August.

Some clubs have elected and installed officers for the coming year. A thank you for past service and welcoming incoming officers is also a possible topic. If your club had a special summer dance, you can write about that.

Note: Please do not comment on raffles or split the pot winners. This information cannot be published in the OFN - it has to do with the Post Office regulations regarding non-profit organizations.

Note 2: Although our 150 word limit has been lifted, try to not exceed 200.
