Officer Reports:

President's report: (Kay Rogers) Kay started the meeting by saying she is going to wait until later to give her report and asked for the Vice-Presidents report.

Vice Presidents report: (Gary Clark)

This will be a short report to say that all the dances for this year are booked and all callers, cuers and dance halls have contracts. It was great working with the TVC Treasurer, Lane Clem to make this happen. Between us we got it done.

The TVC Officers met May 2nd and went over the 2015 schedule of dances. We have yet to hear from the PAC as to what date the Tri-Council dance will be. All other 5th Saturdays were noted and one extra Sunday was added for a TVC Dance. VP Dale will do a good job booking these dances. We also relied on Lane to come up with our annual TVC Budget based off past history.

Don't forget our upcoming, May 31st, 5th Saturday TVC Dance, Here Comes Summer, at the Kinton Grange with Roger Putzler Calling and Dave Cooper Cueing. Please bring a lot of finger food for this dance.

As a side note this is the first time in a long time that the TVC Officers have been all male, excluding the Past President. I say this to make a point, we all agree that we can't do what we do without the support of our wives. They are a big part of how we get things done at our meetings and dances. Treasurer report: (Lane Clem)

Treasurer's report is pretty simple this month because of no dance, so not much activity. There is a \$400 inventory of fabric that will be paid back as Kathy sells it to dancers. This is part of the 2016 Summer Festival preparations to make shirts, skirts, etc. Lane wants to call our attention to 8822B IRS form. As of January 14th this form is a requirement for all organizations with an EIN. The form is to report any change of responsible persons that controls the flow of moneys of the organization and since this is a new form all organizations need to fill it out for the first time. Also, depending on the club's fiscal year don't forget the 990 form you send in each year. This is done online and each club has an account that you can access and fill out. If you have any problems get help from your club or let Lane or Tom help you.

OFN Area Editor Report: (Ferrous Steinka)

Since we are starting the 2014/2015 year with new officers and delegates, I would like to briefly go over what the TVC OFN Editor does. Each club in the TVC has a "Club Reporter" who writes a short monthly report for publication in the Oregon Federation News, OFN. These reports are submitted to the TVC OFN editor who then edits and/or corrects them and then send them to Joyce Sherman, OFN editor. The due date for these reports is the 1st of each month preceding the publication month. For example, the reports which will appear in the upcoming June issue were submitted to me around May 1st. The club reporters are now busy crafting their reports for the July issue.

Caller Advisor & Cuer Advisor report: (Daryl & Yvonne Clendenin)

Daryl is concerned about the future of square dancing; the activity has been in decline for decades and he hopes we can turn this around and Leslye Lane has a plan that she would like us to listen to and see if this new idea will help our activity, because if we don't turn it around it is not going to survive.

Daryl introduced Leslye Lane, Caller Richard Lane's wife, and they are also the President of US West Square Dance Convention. Presentation by Leslye Lane: Much of the inspiration for this came from the keynote speaker at Callerlab. However, our goal is promote square dancing because we believe that if the activity grows, everyone wins!

- **Google Trends** have shown that over the last 10 years, the search for square dance or square dancing has declined 60%. What this means is that people are not looking for square dancing and if they are not looking, then there is no need to find us. Therefore, according to the keynote speaker, 'nobody's talking about square dancing because nobody is talking about square dancing.'
- **Social media** is growing every day. One billion people use Facebook, worldwide, and research has shown primarily people 40 years old and older use it. Over 140 million people use Twitter. Free calendar postings: CRAIG'S LIST Calendar and www.portlanddancing.com.
- According to many, our target audience should be the empty nesters because 20 something's are not interested, 30-40 something's are raising a family and don't have time for the commitment, which leaves the 50 something's and up.
- People use the internet to search for, research, and evaluate everything. Additionally, people need to see something at least seven times before they will buy it. What this means for square dancing is that we need to have a social media and internet presence because more content online means more conversations about ... and we need to target our audience (which can be done through Facebook).
- Outreach efforts have not always been successful for many reasons: timing, presence, and image. It is hard to get excited about something that people cannot do for months (as happens when dancers pass out flyers when

participating in summertime parades), where we can only muster a few folks to participate, or we are in 'uniform' that may or may not interest people.

- Our solution is in the beginning stages, however the more we talk about what we are doing, the more people talk to us about other avenues we may not have thought about using. Our goal is provide an online presence for offline activities.
- MEET-UP (\$72.00 for 6 months): this is an online platform for offline activities and So You Want to Dance is the name of the Meet-up group – we have set up and paid for 6 months.
- ❖ Joining is free and all one has to do is answer a few questions to join.
- ❖ Send out notices for our monthly One Night (Afternoon) Stands – which will follow the ABC program.
- ❖ Open to everyone and encourages dancers to join the activity or the Meetup group.
- ❖ Cards created so people could direct interested people to the group without being pushy and we will have an event monthly, so no waiting! We will let them know they can learn more (Toastmaster approach)
- ❖ June 14, July 26th (National Day of Dance), one in August that we would like to invite all clubs to participate and have a table with day and location of their lessons, if people want to continue learning, and every month after that.
