Officer Reports:

President's report: (Gary Clark)

This is Dale's project during his term as State President and it makes a lot of sense to make friends all around the state of Oregon. I'm proud of how the Council officers are pulling together as a team to plan all the TVC functions for the next year. Good Job all of you.

Vice Presidents report: (Dale Brabham)

The Hahn Barn Dance was a big success. We had a great turnout of 109, including folks from 8 TVC clubs, independents, and members from 5-clubs outside of the TVC. Thanks for supporting this

dance by your participation, and your help setting up and cleaning up. The level of participation and profit (net \$236.50) make this dance a bench mark for us to keep in mind for all our dances.

The planning of the dances for 2015 year is at this point well in hand (table included at the end of this report). Right now we are in the middle of a very ambitious series of dances where the TVC is sponsoring a dance in each of five months in a row; we hope to make all of these dances as successful as was the Hahn Barn dance. This takes commitment from all of our delegates to serve on committees to make these dances happen without too much burden on anyone. Please sign up for a committee and make a commitment to recruit people from your clubs to bring snacks and help in other ways.

TVC received a nice thank you letter from the Oregon Food Bank for the \$100 Donation the TVC made last month.

State Delegates report: (Kathy Worthington) All the State Insurance forms from each club have been turned into me, thank you Delegates for getting this done on time. This is an important step in keeping all our clubs insurance and to protect us all concerning any liability claim against us.

State Youth Activities Report: (Kathy Roberts)

Mid-Winter 2015 (January 23-25) Youth schedule has been set and we are now working on filling in the details for our Travel Adventure. On Friday, we will open our table at 1:00 pm. We will be giving the first 25 families who register the Albany Visitors Association string backpacks again. All youth will also be given individual goodie bags. I have been talking with 2015 Summer Festival Youth coordinator. We will be including information on “continuing our adventure” at Summer Festival in our bags. I have requested a youth ribbon for one of our prizes for Saturday evening.

For our Friday night, our off-site party, we will be back at Abby's Pizza for a game night with karaoke, pizza, and dancing to Jonny Roberts.

- Insurance has also been requested.

On Saturday, we will sponsor another Square Dancing with Style clinic from 1:00-2:00 pm in the Mainstream Hall. Everyone is welcome.

During the day on Saturday, the kids will be looking for different club/council badges again. Please spread the word so everyone is prepared for the kids.

Saturday evening the Youth After-Party will be between 10:30-11:30 pm. Our callers will be the energetic fun duo, KC Curtis and Jonny Roberts with Bev Flint as our cuer.

Please let families in your area know that we have scholarships available through the state to help pay for ribbons for families who need financial assistant. Contact Kathy Roberts kathy@4roberts.us. We have already approved 6 ribbons, with 2 more pending completed Mid-Winter applications from the family.

We will be sending out our 8-page Adventure book again this year with a welcome letter to all of the youth as they register. We will also be sending the Adventure book to all of the councils/clubs in November.

Also, there is a \$1,000 scholarship available from the USDA and seniors need to start applying now. The scholarships are for seniors graduating this year that are also active in a Federated Square Dance Club. Oregon Federation has scholarships too; let me know if you have any questions on this. The process requires some paperwork to be completed about the student.

Another item is there is monies available for youth to go to the Mid-Winter Festival, etc. Let me know if there is a need you are aware of.

PAC Delegate report: (Kathy Roberts)

It was mentioned in the PAC meeting that the TVC was having a dance on the fifth Friday this month which is when PAC has their dances, and they were concerned why we did that as we are not to have dances in competition with theirs. This was not intended to compete with theirs and it is not a square dance but a round dance party which generally speaking is not the same dancers; anyway we will try not to do that again even though PAC does have Friday night dances that in an indirect way does compete with our Saturday night dances, especially at the Tri-Council dances we host and they are to be part of the Tri-Council Dance group.

PAC's 5th Friday dance is this Friday, October 31 at the oak Grove Community Center (1496 SE Cedar Avenue, Oak Grove). Caller and cuer will be George & Patty Hermann. Pre-rounds at 7:30, Mainstream dance 8:00-10:30, with every third tip Plus. This is a Halloween Costume dance (optional) with prizes.

Old Business:

Gary brought up need for us to purchase the fabric material that the TVC bought for the dancer outfits to promote the 2016 Summer Festival. If you are going to buy this material, Kathy Roberts has the material for you now. Please get with Kathy and help her by buying this material which she has all cut and ready to sell. You should get going on this project of making shirts and skirts so we will be ready to go out and promote the Summer Festival in 2016 which will be at the Seaside Convention Center.

Kay Rogers, Past President and 2016 Summer Festival 2016 Chairman. For 2016 summer festival, how do you feel about dancing all on one floor? The one floor idea will be considered next meeting again. If we can get by with one floor it will save a lot of money and work. We need to advertise which we are doing and will not be able to change our minds after we make the decision. The options are to rent or purchase the floor material, dance on carpet, dance on tile, or schedule the dancing as alternating sessions of Mainstream, Plus, Rounds, Contra, Advanced Rounds on one floor; if we decide on laying down flooring for this dance, it will be 5,000 square feet to pay for and to lay. Kay recommends one floor because it costs about \$2,000 to rent floors and you have to lay it down and use tape to hold it down; a lot of work. We will plan according to what you want to do. With this is mind talk to your club members and explain the costs and labor verses using one floor and bring your answer to the November meeting. Dale Worthington brought up the idea of square dancing on the carpet in the other part of the building part of the time as a possible alternative to laying a floor.

Kay also asked for any volunteers to work on registration for the summer festival.

Gary brought up the New Year's Eve Dance items that we discussed last meeting but did not make a decision; noting that we needed a decision so Gary made the decision because we needed to print the tickets which are here to be distributed to the Delegates tonight so they can sell them to our club members. The decisions made were to charge \$13 for one or \$25 for a couple, the times will be dinner at 7:30, dancing at 8:30, and goes to midnight.

Also Gary suggested promoting club visitations to club anniversary dances in our area. His suggestion is to watch for and go to clubs on a visitation to their anniversary dances.

New Business:

New business item from Gary Clark is to have us promote visitations to PAC and Evergreen clubs, and when you do this put it in your TVC Delegate report so we can see if there is an increase in visitations of TVC Clubs.

A sales rep from The Oregonian, Paul Fracasso, contacted Carolene Siebert of the Valley Squares and suggested the Square Dance Clubs put an ad in the Holiday Gift Guide to advertise dance lessons the clubs have starting in January. The ad would run after Thanksgiving on November 28th, and goes out to 883,000 people in the Portland/Metro/Vancouver area. The cost of the ad would be \$299 for 1/8 page ad. There are 7-clubs who have agreed to be in on this ad; three from the TVC;

Sunset Promenaders, Toe Draggers, and Valley Squares; and four from the PAC; Buzzin' Bees, Country Cut-Ups, Happy Hoppers and Oaky Doaks.

The ad has been created and Linda Ray-Keeney from Tri Squares did the art work for the ad. I thought we could direct people to the TVC website, but the sales rep said he checked out the website and thought it would be too confusing for someone to navigate and suggested a more direct approach by using a personal phone number in the ad; so I agreed to take the calls and direct the callers to the clubs closest to them.

What I am asking PAC and the TVC to do is to contribute \$50 each to this ad. This \$100 will reduce each clubs cost from \$42.71 to \$28.43. A motion was made by Kay Rogers to have the TVC pay \$50 toward this ad, Bob Allen Seconded it, and the motion passed.

Gary brought up the December and January TVC meetings schedule. There will be no December meeting because of the Holidays. Then there will be a meeting in the Hillsboro Odd Fellows Hall in January on the fourth Monday; this is an annual potluck dinner and meeting called "The President's Meeting" and we invite all the past, present club presidents, and anyone else that will come to the meeting. This is also the meeting where the TVC Recognition Award is given out to someone that deserves recognition for good work promoting square dancing. So email Gary anyone you think deserves this award and Gary will make the decision on this. Include in your suggested name some of the work this person or couple have done to deserve this award.
