New Business:

Plan to get the Fall Square Dance and Round dance Lessons moving now: Presented by Ken Marifke.

Each Club needs to start thinking about lessons Now, not at the end of August. Start now to get the ball rolling. To do this we need to have clubs get their lesson plans done by the June TVC Meeting and into TVC along with PAC Clubs.

Working together, PAC, TVC and other Councils, we can get more people to start lessons and get more information out to the public.

Having both Square and Round Dance lessons information in one place will simplify telling people where lessons are on each night of the week, for example, someone stops and talks to you about lessons, you tell them what your club has, but they are busy that night, so how about telling them about another club that is having lessons on a night that they are free.

By having a joint list of Lessons we can tell people where and when there are lessons anywhere in the Portland and Vancouver areas.

Then see if all the local newspapers will print the list and get the local TV and Radio station to get the word out. Hand out information at local festivals, and county and state fairs, etc.

We as clubs, TVC, and PAC can also put signs up on building, on our cars, and roadside signs.

How about going into any store in your dance clothes and have available a card you can give them. The people do come up and ask about your clothes and where you dance. Ask the manager if they would allow you to put up a poster in the store.

We need to work together in getting more people into Square and Round dance in order to keep it going. This is not to get people into our own club. That will happen if you, as a club, show your best side and showing how you work with other clubs.

Question: I understand that there is a publication, and I would like to know which person is doing this publication. Response: Right now we are just getting the information in from the clubs.
