Updated officer information - Clubs are reminded to go and update their officer's information online. The election information is sent to the email listed online and is being sent out early February. A significant percentage of the clubs have not updated the information recently.

OFN - The OFN provides free advertising for clubs. It provides both local and national exposure for your club's activities.

Please spread the word to your new students about the resources that the OFN provides.

USDA Scholarship- The deadline for USDA scholarships has been extended to the end of March. Three scholarships are available, \$2,500, \$1,500, and \$1,000.

Summer Festival -

Nobody volunteered to organize the 2026 Summer Festival, so there will not be one.

Are there any clubs interested in organizing future Summer Festivals?

The club/clubs that organize the Festival split the net proceeds 50/50. Although the last Festival only had an attendance of 225 people, there was a profit of \$1600 that was split between the Federation and the organizing club.

The profit was significantly increased by the side activities, including the raffle, the used clothing sale, and at least one other activity. 50% of the used clothing sale is given to the Festival. In addition, 100% of the trail's end dance goes to the organizing club.

The Federation does supply some money to enable the summer festival organizing.

If there are no Summer Festivals, the Federation is losing one of its funding events and would possibly need to ask clubs for extra dues.

Zelle- Robert Swee reported that their club is successfully using Zelle for their dancers to pay admission to their dances. There is no fee for using Zelle. They had considered using square and paypal but both of these required fees to be paid.

Potato Festival - The Potato Festival is canceled due to a caller double booking.

New dancer badge- One Council had many new dancers earn their new dancer badges by attending new dancer jamborees.

Mainstream/Plus/Advanced dance moves reclassifications

In the discussion regarding the new dance move reclassifications, there were mixed opinions about how to implement it and how much trouble it will be. There was a question as to whether or not it could be forced to be used as the callers and cuers are considered independent contractors.

There are 8 moves that were taken out of "A" and pushed down to "plus". There were moves taken out of "mainstream" and pushed up to "plus".

One suggestion - open your dance ½ hour early and teach one new move a session (needed to bring the plus dancers up to speed on the additional "A" moves).

Another suggestion - your biggest allegiance is to increasing membership of your own club, and do what makes sense for your club

Cuer recording - Brooke Davidson wrote an article for the OFN regarding music licensing, answering questions which she was previously asked about. A question was asked regarding whether or not cues recorded over the music was covered by the current licensing. Brooke's interpretation of the rules was that if the cues were recorded on the same channel as the music, it needed a "mechanical license" which would be a different license than currently is provided, but if they were on separate channels played at the same time it would be OK. Recording the cues on the same channel would be changing the music, which makes the difference in the licensing requirements. Brooke does not present herself as a lawyer and is giving her understanding of the rules. There is more in her article but this is one point we focused on in the Federation meeting.

Medical training - Thanks to those that attended the medical training provided by Lori.

Insurance - Next year, Vicki will try to do all the insurance renewal via email and online. The insurance calendar year is January - December regardless of your club's calendar year. If you have December graduates, if you graduate them on December 31, you don't have to pay for the current year. If you graduate them before December 31, they are not covered until you pay the full year's insurance cost which is not prorated for the short year.

Bottle deposit information - PAC is successfully running their bottle deposit. Although the Oregon Bottle deposit requires charities to be a 501(c)(3) to be part of the program, PAC is not. They submitted their determination letter and it was accepted. When we get our determination letter, we can also submit our application and we can see if we are accepted if we want to try this.
