Update new Delegate information to TVC: The Executive Board has new revised copies of the New Delegate information, with recommended changes. Discussion about changes. No decision made.

New Business:

Next TVC Meeting: The next TVC Meeting will be our President's Potluck and Meeting, at the Hillsboro IOOF Hall in Hillsboro, on Monday, January 27, 2025. Potluck at 6 p.m., Meeting at 7 p.m. The TVC Recognition Award will be presented at this Meeting. If the weather is bad on that date, the TVC will postpone the Potluck and Meeting until February. The TVC will not hold a Meeting in December 2024.

Round dancing at Jamborees (Tami Helms): I am the PAC Vice President, and the PAC is going through some revisions in their book. It had an article on how to grow square dance clubs. It is recommended that Jamborees not be held all on the same nights as each other. It also might not be such a good idea to do round dancing at Jamborees. The idea of Jamborees is for everyone to dance as much as possible. Round dance mixers may be done if rounds are done at Jamborees, instead of dancers having to sit during dances. Also, some round dance moves might be taught to the new dancers.

Round of the Month selection process: Tami Helms gave a report on how the Rounds of the Month are selected by each Council in the State. Every Council has an appointed (by the Council President) Cuer Advisor. Each Council in Oregon selects a Round of the Month on a rotating basis. The Round Dance Chairman sends out a list of selections to be chosen. Sometimes someone else will recommend a round dance, which is then screened by the Screening Committee. It is up to the Cuer Advisor (of the selected Council) to pick the Round of the Month. It is suggested that the Cuer Advisor do this in front of a group of people, who usually does the voting. By the tenth of the month, the results are given to Tami, who then sends them to the OFN. If you are not satisfied, please talk to your Cuer Advisor. Discussion.
